Federal Historic Preservation Grants April 26, 2024



When you have a direct Federal award from the National Park Service, the SHPO can help with:

- Review of Proposed Grant-funded Work
- Guidance on Competitive Procurement
 of Professional Services
- Guidance on Preservation
 Covenants/Easements



Procurement help:

- Local governments typically operate as normal
- Non-profits may need help conducting procurement similar to a government
- SHPO can provide guidance and templates for Invitation to Bid and RFP/RFQ



Review of Grant-Funded Work:

- Section 106 review process requires NPS to consult with SHPO to determine effects of proposed work on historic property
- SHPO will review to be sure proposed work meets Secretary of the Interior's Standards



South Carolina Department of Archives & History Invitation to Bid:

- For projects where you hire a contractor to make repairs
- Best case is that you have an architect working with you who can produce an Invitation to Bid and help with contract administration
- SHPO can provide a basic template for an Invitation to Bid
- SHPO cannot recommend contractors, but can share names of those who have worked on past grant-funded projects



Request for Qualifications (RFQ):

- For projects where you hire architect/engineer services
- SHPO can provide a basic template for an RFQ
- SHPO cannot recommend architects/engineers, but can share names of those who have worked on past grant-funded projects



Help with advertising bid invitations:

- Bid invitations may be sent directly to prospective contractors
- SHPO can help place free advertisement in "South Carolina Business Opportunities" to get more exposure for your bid invitation.



NPS preservation grants require covenant agreements:

- If SHPO is required to hold the agreement, then agreement is signed between SHPO and the owner.
- SHPO can provide the standard agreement document with complete details
- After SHPO signs, owner will sign and record with property deed at county deed office
