The Savannah River Plant (SRP) was

built 1950-56 by Du Pont for the Atomic Energy Commission. SRP, a nuclear production plant, produced tritium and plutonium for national

defense during the Cold War. Creating a 310-sq.-mi. site in three counties meant moving all

residents from their homes in Ellenton, Dunbarton, Meyers Mill, Leigh, and other area communities.
