

The <u>South Carolina Standards and Guidelines for</u>
<u>Archaeological Investigations</u> were recently updated and now include guidance on:

- Archaeological Reconnaissance Surveys
- Archaeological Metal Detecting
- · Remote Sensing in Archaeological Contexts
- Archaeological Probability Models

References to state and federal laws have been updated and includes a section on the Native American Graves Protection and Repatriation Act (NAGRAPA).

Nominations are now being accepted for the 2025 South Carolina Historic Preservation Awards. Sponsored by Preservation South Carolina, the SC Department of Archives and History, and the Office of the Governor, the Historic Preservation Awards recognize exceptional accomplishments in the preservation, rehabilitation, and interpretation of South Carolina's architectural and cultural heritage. The six award categories are: Honor Awards, Stewardship Awards, Preservation Service Awards, Heritage Tourism Award, Elected Official Honor Award, and Governor's Award. ### FY25 Federal Historic Preservation Fund Grant Applications

Applications and instructions for the FY 2025 federal Historic Preservation Fund subgrants are now available at <a href="this link">this link</a>. Administered by the SHPO, these matching grants can assist two types of projects:

• *Survey and Planning Projects:* eligible projects include surveys of historic properties, National Register nominations, preservation education, and preservation planning.

Applications will be accepted until 5:00 PM, May 1, 2025.

 Stabilization Projects: eligible projects include stabilizing historic buildings or protecting historic buildings from the adverse effects of the weather. Stabilization Projects are limited to projects located in South Carolina's <u>Certified Local Government (CLG)</u> communities.

Any local government, non-profit, or institution in South Carolina may apply for a Survey and Planning Project. Local governments, non-profits and institutions located in a CLG community may also apply for a Stabilization Project. At least ten percent of the state's annual allocation from the National Park Service must be awarded to CLGs. Grant awards generally range from \$2,500 to \$35,000.

### New National Historic Landmark in SC



On December 16, 2024 the Secretary of the Interior announced 19 new National Historic Landmarks (NHLs). One of the newly designated NHLs is the Charleston Cigar Factory, originally built in 1882. It was recognized as the site of a historic strike in 1945-46 led by African American women to improve pay, working conditions and job treatment. The strike was "highly illustrative of the post-World War II national strike wave, which was the largest in the history of the labor movement in the United States." ### **Upcoming Grant Application Deadlines**

January 28, 2025 The National Park Service's <u>Historically Black Colleges & Universities</u> <u>Grant Program</u> (HBCU) is now accepting applications for FY2024 competitive grants. HBCU grants are funded by the Historic Preservation Fund (HPF), administered by the NPS, and fund a broad range of pre-preservation planning activities and physical preservation work for historic sites that are listed in or eligible for listing in the National Register of Historic Places or as a National Historic Landmark. Congress appropriated \$11 million for the HBCU Grant Program in FY2024. For more information and to apply for the HBCU Grant Program visit Grants.gov: <u>P24AS00547</u>. Any accredited Historically Black Colleges & Universities are eligible to apply for funding. **February 1, 2025** Richland County Conservation Commission (RCCC) Historic Preservation Grants: The RCCC is offering grants of up to \$50,000 (20% match required) to help non-profit organizations, governmental agencies, educational institutions, and commercial entities preserve and protect historic buildings and sites in Richland County. Applications are due February 1, 2025. For more information and eligibility criteria, visit this webpage.

**February 28, 2025 Unity Cemetery Preservation Fund**. The Fund supports preservation of historic African American cemeteries (dating from circa 1800 to 1942) in the southeastern United States. An annual award of up to \$50,000 will be made each year. NEW March 31, 2025 (Q1 2025 deadline) T-Mobile Hometown Grants. T-Mobile awards up to \$50,000 for shovel-ready projects in small towns that foster connections, including outdoor spaces, the arts, community centers, local libraries, revitalizing historic buildings, and more. Proposals must include plans, budget, timeline, anticipated impact, and up to five letters of support. Elected officials, town managers/employees, tribal leaders, or nonprofit community leaders from small towns with population less than 50,000 can apply. **NEW March 3, 2025 National Fund for Sacred Spaces** is accepting Letters of Intent for the 2025 cohort of the National Fund. The National Fund offers selected congregations technical and financial support for significant capital projects at historic sacred places. **NEW March 18, 2025 Semiquincentennial Grant Opportunity.** The National Park Service is accepting applications for this grant that supports the preservation of sites and structures listed in the National Register of Historic Places that commemorate the founding of the nation (defined as ending in 1815). Projects can include pre-preservation plans, studies, and reports as well as physical preservation. Eligible properties may be owned by the state, local governments, non-profits, tribes and other applicant types. Congress appropriated \$7 million in funding for this round of grants, which do not require a match. For more information review the grant opportunity P24AS00546.
