HISTORIC PRESERVATION STATE GRANT FUND APPLICATION

The Historic Preservation State Grant Fund application for FY 25-26 is now available. The purpose of the State Grant Fund is to support historic preservation projects that benefit local communities through the physical repair and rehabilitation of South Carolina's historic buildings.

This year applicants may apply for either a **Planning Grant** to develop "bid-ready" plans and specifications OR a **Stabilization Grant** to assist with historic building stabilization and weatherization projects.
