The lecture title, "South Carolina's Lost Hundred Years - the Story of Santa Elena" discussed the activity of the French and Spanish in South Carolina between the arrival of Christopher Columbus in 1492 and the English Settlement in Jamestown in 1607. It also included a discussion on the interactions with the local tribes of indigenous Americans. The lecture was well-received by the public.

2 SC Organizations Receive AACRN Funding

The African American Civil Rights Network recently released the awardees of their partnered grant with the Association of African American Museums. The grant allocated \$477,205 to projects, including 2 South Carolina organization. Brainerd Institute Receives

Funding From National Trust for Historic Preservation

The Brainerd Institute in Chester, SC received funds from the African American Cultural Heritage Action Fund to protect and preserve the Black history of the site. The Brainerd Institute was founded in 1866 as an elite educational institution for Black students. Funding will support the hire of expert consultants to develop a master plan to offer cultural, arts, and literacy programs at the institute once more. Goodwill Parochial School Homecoming

On August 10th, the Goodwill Educational and Historical Society (GEHS) held a homecoming at the Goodwill Cultural Center, formerly the Goodwill Parochial School for Black students in the Mayesville area. At this event, they reminisced on the importance of the school, described their current goals and activities, and detailed their future endeavors. GEHS received a state grant of \$132,000 from the SC SHPO to repair the second floor of the building. This grant called for a cash match that the society was able to raise. An earmark of \$594,000 was also awarded at the event from House representatives David Weeks and William Wheeler.

FY24-25 Historic Preservation State Grant Fund The Historic Preservation State Grant Fund application is now available with a due date of September 19, 2024. The purpose of the State Grant Fund is to support historic preservation projects that benefit local communities through the physical repair and rehabilitation of South Carolina's historic buildings. This year applicants may apply for either a **Planning Grant** to develop "bid-ready" plans and specifications OR a Stabilization Grant to assist


