TRAINING SPOTLIGHT

Specific Schedule Revision

Public Records are often living documents that grow and change with the times, and the same goes for the Specific Schedules that cover them! The Records Management Division has created the Request for Revision of Schedule Form (ARM-16) to keep your schedules accurate and up to date.

The ARM-16 is used to request that an element of an established Agency Specific Schedule be revised or updated. These requests can cover any topic such as retention, records description, or even the header information used to designate the office, division or program unit the schedule applies to.

All revision requests must include a description of what element is to be updated, along with a brief justification for that change. Please send the completed form to your assigned Records Analyst, or to rm@scdah.sc.gov.

Depicted below is a hand drawn Bird's Eye View of the city of Columbia in 1909, showing major buildings, churches, railroads and other structures.




ELECTRONIC RECORDS DAY



ANNOUNCING SC SHRAB MICROGRANT PROGRAM





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As part of the funding from the National Historical Publications and Records Commission (NHPRC), the SC SHRAB will award a maximum individual award amount of \$1,000.00, to fund up to 15 microgrants to provide non-competitive funding for capital support and/or essential needs purchases to benefit an archival program of South Carolina institutions housing historical records. There is no cost share for these microgrants; SC SHRAB will provide 100% of the funding.
