

Proper names are entered according to the most frequent spelling they have in the text. Common names are arranged according to their modern spelling except for "periaugoe" and "duffields" which are entered according to the most frequent spelling. The names of the Commissioners of the Indian Trade are preceded by an asterisk which serves as a cross reference to the entry, "Commissioners of the Indian Trade." In general, the subentries are in alphabetical order except where it appeared to be more reasonable to arrange them chronologically. For example, the entry of each Commissioner's name, followed by page numbers indicating places of mention, is followed by a chronological arrangement of subentries concerning his appointment, qualification and attendance to his duties, but an alphabetical arrangement of any other entries regarding his relationship to the Indian trade is given afterwards.

The titles of the acts of Assembly referred to in the text are given as they are in Thomas Cooper, ed., The Statutes at Large of South Carolina (Columbia, 1837), volume II, and are numbered in the order of ratification by the General Assembly.
